I Corinthians 2

Discussion Questions:

- 1. Paul contrasts the wisdom of the world with the wisdom of God throughout this chapter. To the world, God's wisdom, is seen as foolish (v1).
 - a. Can you describe some example's of how foolish God's wisdom seems to the world?
 - b. Can you describe some example's of how Christians seek to be more polished and persuasive instead of embracing the "foolishness" of God's wisdom?
 - c. How does it make you feel that some people think that your faith ideas are goofy? What is your usual response?
- 2. What motivated Paul's ministry? How does that shape your motivation in life and work? (v2)
- 3. Is Paul being honest about his fear and trembling? What was he so afraid of? How did this become a platform for the Spirit's work?
- 4. Verse 6-16: I didn't spend a lot of time in the message about these texts, but there is some very valuable material here about the work of the Spirit. It connects to verses 1-5 because it is Paul's explanation of how the Spirit enabled him to be the bearer of good news.
 - a. Why do we need the Spirit to understand the mysteries of God?
 - b. What differentiates the spirit of the world from the Spirit of God?
 - c. How do you know that you are genuinely listening to the Spirit? Give examples to explain.
 - d. How might you make yourself more open to the direction of the Spirit? What spiritual practices might help you be led by the Spirit?
 - e. Why does Paul describe the Spirit of God the mind of Christ (v16)?
- 5. Apply this to the work of evangelism in the church. Describe how evangelism and the work of the Spirit interrelate? What does this mean for a church that wants to be serious about evangelism? Can Alpha be a powerful encounter with Christ apart from the Spirit? Explain using the content of this passage.
