A Final Report from Brian Buhler, Senior Pastor

It's difficult limiting this report to the past year, when my head and heart are reflecting on the past 12 years...well, actually 40 years. I'm in that *once-in-a-lifetime* season of life where every event becomes "the last"; the last wet Easter benediction, the last Advent, the last Christmas Eve, the last baby dedication, etc. etc. Oh, and the last Annual Meeting!
